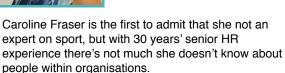

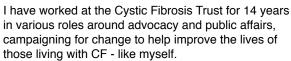


Name: Lynsey Beswick

Sian incorporates games within her classes to add a social component to the experience, which gives older people to make new friends, be active, and beat loneliness.
